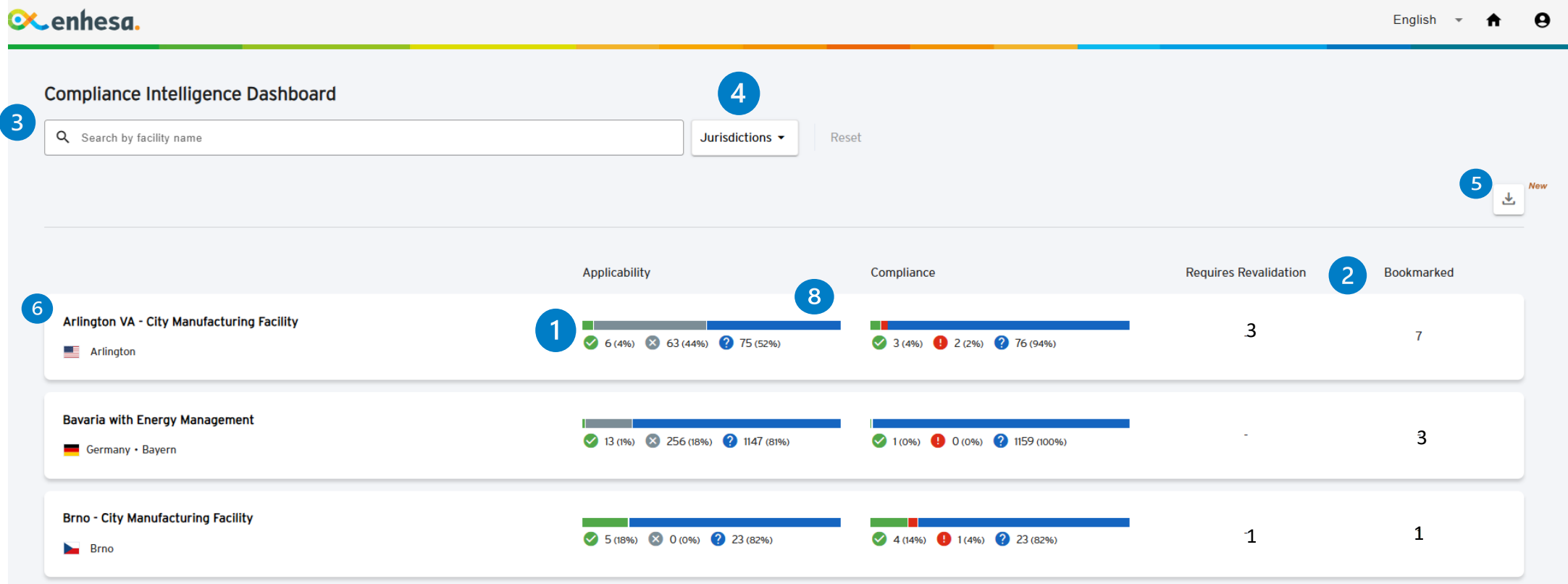

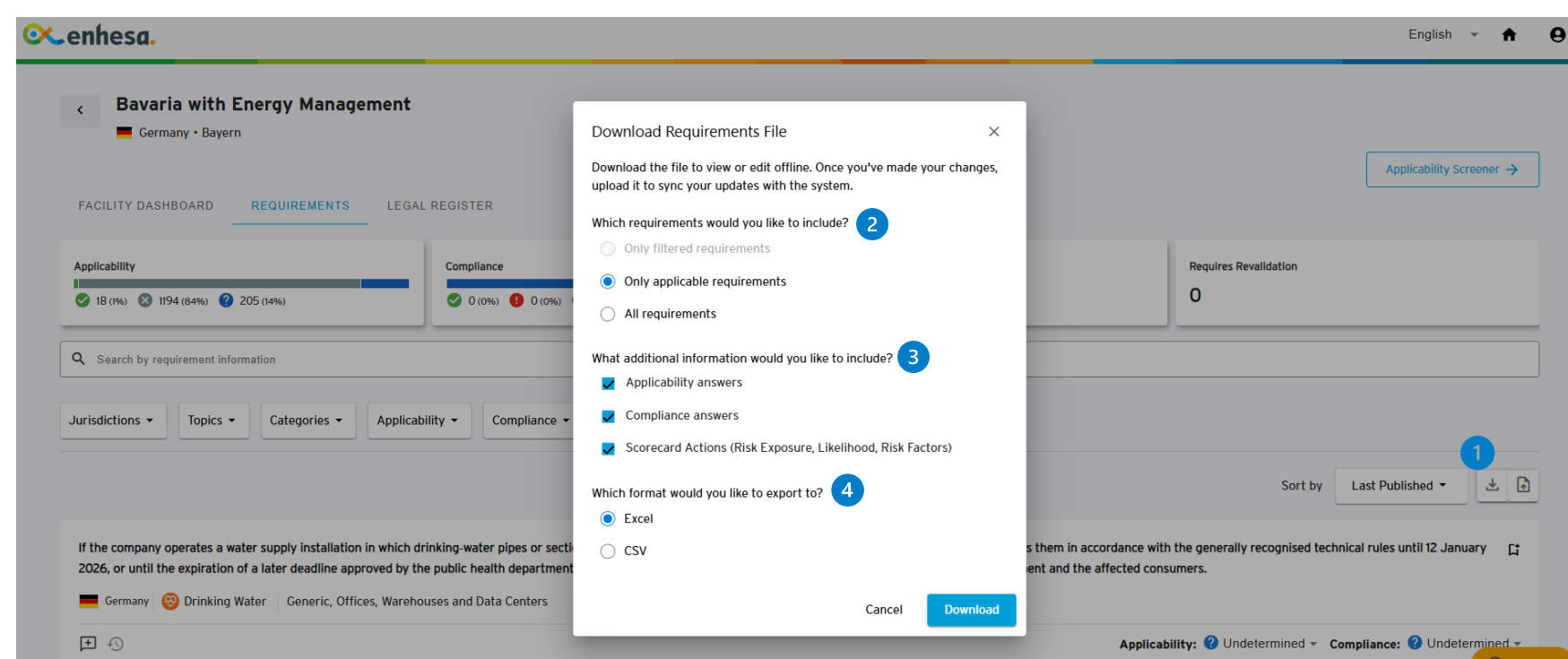

Requirements View

1. Topic filter options were located on the left side of the page, and as you scroll further you would also see filters for applicability, compliance, and category.
2. Search bar available
3. No top-of-page metrics.
4. The platform used single-select buttons for filter selections and for setting applicability and compliance.
5. Requirements were sorted by topic only, with no option to sort by **Last Published**.
6. Bookmarks were not available.
7. “Previous Actions” (audit trail) and comments were presented together in one section.
8. **Additional Details** opened a small popup with guide notes and related regulations.
9. A separate **Show Changes** button displayed change history.

Downloading Scorecards

1. Scorecards can be downloaded from the **Requirements** page of each facility.
2. Users can choose to download:
 - Only **filtered requirements**
 - Only **applicable requirements**
 - **All requirements**
3. Additional options allow users to include:
 - **Applicability answers**
 - **Compliance answers**
 - **Scorecard Actions** (Risk Exposure, Likelihood, Risk Factors)
4. Downloads are available in **Excel or CSV** formats.
5. Scorecards are now **macro-free**, supporting quicker downloading, smoother online collaboration and easier sharing.
6. The updated scorcard layout contains **fewer, more streamlined tabs**, making navigation clearer.
